## **Buyers Notes**

- · Providers must decide whether a renovation or new building should include ceiling lifts, as it can be hard to retrofit the tracks.
- · Weight limits vary widely: Make sure the lift can accommodate a specific population. Fixed motors tend to have higher weight capacities.
- · In addition to the benefits of decreasing workplace injuries, evidence points to better patient outcomes, such as fewer pressure ulcers and promotion of ambulation for residents.
