#### **Buyer Notes**

- The tables have to be adjustable and easy for an employee to move. Many residents prefer to use them not in bed, but while in a chair.
- Many times a facility will be able to pick which color is on the top part of the table. They should be sure to coordinate with the overall colors in the room set.
- Some overbed tables now come with a "braille" touch point, a selling platform for facilities with vision-impaired patients.
- Amenities that can be added to some overbed tables include a mirror and storage areas.
- Overbed tables can take a beating, ranging from spills to overly heavy items placed upon them. Prepare to budget for new ones, or risk ruining the look of a resident's room.
