Buyers Notes

- Consider the parts that are available for a bed. Sometimes, the cheapest bed may not have a robust availability of parts.
- Factor in rail use before purchasing. Rails are not specifically prohibited, but you must plan for their use. Less is always more.
- Contemplate weight capacity and width of bed. Wider beds that can bear a larger load are becoming more of the standard in long-term care settings.
- Design rooms to appear more like residents' homes by using wood grain head and footboards and other customized features.
- · Be cognizant of the latest tariff fines when ordering a bed.
