Overbed tables

Snapshot

Lowest priced unit: \$67 | **Mid-range priced unit: \$126** | **Highest priced unit: \$362**

Typical delivery time: 2 days to 5 weeks

Typical delivery charges:
\$15 to \$30 (quantity matters)

Average life span of product:
4 to 10 years, depending on materials

Standard warranty:

Typically 1 year

Average maintenance costs per year:
Castor replacements are most common so budget \$15 per year, or replace the units outright

Buyers Notes

- These tables can really take a beating, both at the base and on the tops, so if you want to keep them in use for a long time and not shop again for a while, lean toward higher quality materials — even if the price tag is higher, advised one expert emphasizing the long view.
- Even though they seem like a simple product, be sure to give them a “test run,” one veteran cautioned. They must be compatible with room layouts, undersides of furniture and flooring surfaces.
- Inquire with staff — especially CNAs — as to what is actually used, and useful. Some of these tables come with bells and whistles that might sound good to a buyer in a benevolent mood, but might not be so helpful or practiced.
- Know when to cut losses if surfaces start to crack or become uneven, experts advise. It’s often better/safer to buy new units.
